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Guide to Standards

To help guests ascertain their suitability for any course, each course description is accompanied by a simple broad indication of the range of standards that apply to each course. Approximate equivalent Associated Board examination achievements are listed below. **This is only a rough guide and we require no formal qualifications.** Some course descriptions include more precise levels. Please ask us if in doubt, and please note that many courses accept multiple standards.

Elementary – Grades 1 to 3
Intermediate – Grades 4 to 6
Advanced – Grades 7 and 8 and beyond

Young People's Course Rates

Guests who were under 27 years of age on 1 January 2014 are entitled to an automatic 25% discount on the basic Residential or Non-residential price of any residential course or on the fee applicable to one day courses. Proof of age may be required. **This offer does not apply to room supplements nor to talks or concerts.**

FREE EVENTS FOR STUDENTS AND YOUNG PEOPLE

Full time students and in many instances all those under the age of 26 are entitled to attend most Benslow Music concerts free. Full time students are also admitted to the Roderick Swanston Lectures free of charge.

FREE COURSE PLACES FOR MUSIC STUDENTS

From time to time we are able to offer competent young musicians free or heavily discounted places on courses where balance, number or instrumentation is critical and where we have been unable to recruit the full complement of paying players. Please let us know if you would like to be placed on our list of such musicians.

AM I GOOD ENOUGH?

The answer is, probably, yes! We pride ourselves on bringing the very best out of our students whatever their level of achievement. We specify an approximate ability range which will help you choose your course, but once happy with that – and we will gladly offer advice - nobody need feel that they are competing with anyone except themselves. Where a course is particularly demanding we say so, and our carefully selected tutors are expert at giving equal attention and respect to everyone. So don't be shy!

ARRIVING AND DEPARTING

Normally we ask guests to check in after about 4 pm on the first day of a course. When this is different the course description should say so. If you have made a long journey and expect to arrive early please let us know.

Your welcome pack includes your key, vital information about Benslow Music and a course timetable. Tea, coffee and cake is available until the bar opens.

Dinner is served at 7 pm (except on days when we are hosting a public concert, when it is usually served at 6.30 pm).

If you are likely to arrive late, please let us know as soon as you can and we will make arrangements to set a meal aside for you.

Most courses end with tea and cakes at 4 pm on the final day, although the time can slightly vary from course to course.

Day courses begin at 10 am. We break for an hour's lunch at 1 pm and end not after 5 pm.

How to get here

Benslow Music Trust's campus is a five-minute walk from Hitchin train station, which is served by fast, frequent trains from Cambridge, Peterborough and London King's Cross. Road access from the AI(M) and the MI is swift, and we are within easy reach of Luton and Stansted airports.

SLEEP WELL

Lunch (except on Sundays) and breakfast are buffet-style meals but you will enjoy at-table service for dinner and for the traditional British Sunday roast.

We buy official Fairtrade products where possible and all our meat is Red Tractor assured and so originates from British farms.

We cater for a range of special diets. Please select which applies to you when you apply for your course, and please tell us about any allergies. Unfortunately we cannot provide kosher or halal meats.





The Bar, often tended by the popular Ken, is open for business at lunchtime, through the afternoon and in the evenings and is always available to residents and visitors as a lounge area. A flat-screen television is available in the Garden Room extension.

THE GARDENS

Our beautiful gardens are an integral part of the Benslow Music experience and provide an inviting space in which to relax and re-gather energies between sessions You are welcome to wander freely. If Jif, our gardener, happens to be around and if he's not too busy doing something else he will happily tell you about any plant species on the site and no doubt offer off the cuff tips for your own garden. The wooded parts of the grounds contain some magnificent tree specimens. Please take care not to get too close to the bee hives, particularly in swarming season.

OUR MUSIC FACILITIES

We boast ten designated rehearsal and practice rooms, including two halls suitable for larger ensembles and public events. Each space includes at least one piano. Our piano stock includes well-

maintained Steinway, Yamaha, Steinweg-Grotrian and Bechstein baby grand pianos and a full size Welmar grand. We also possess a fine Goble harpsichord modelled on a 1727 Christian Zell original as well as virginals, a spinet and a clavichord. Our keyboard stock is completed by a restored Broadwood square piano dating from the 1820s. We also possess a state of the art hi-fi system and PA facilities.

COME EARLY, LEAVE LATE

If you are travelling from afar or simply want time to acclimatise to and/or recover from your course then simply add an extra night (or two) to your stay at our competitive Bed and Breakfast rates.







The result was the remarkable works of César Franck, Saint-Saëns, Debussy, Ravel, Chausson, Fauré and many others all set against the Third Republic with its salons and the Dreyfus trial encapsulated in the works of the Impressionists, Proust's great novel and the writings of Baudelaire, Verlaine and Rimbaud. Roderick Swanston's fascinating course will explore in depth some of the music and its interweaving with the other arts, as well as the social and political events of this fascinating period.

LECTURE I: THE MAKING OF BACH

Many famous composers reportedly spring from nowhere. This is never true, and in the case of JS Bach particularly not the case, as he copied out more music than almost any other contemporary composer. This lecture will look at the evolution of German music between Heinrich Schütz and JS Bach and explore how Bach adopted and modified his rich national inheritance as well the effect that French and Italian styles had on his music.

LECTURE 2: POST-IMPRESSIONISM AND MUSIC

Throughout the nineteenth century music and the other arts were perceived as being linked. Music painted pictures, pictures embodied music. Baudelaire's Correspondences and Wagner's Gesamtkunstwerk both pointed to a shared foundation of the arts despite their external differences. Yet when Stravinsky declared in 1934 that "music cannot express anything outside itself" he seemed merely to echo what had been a growing idea since the 1880s, not least in the implications of the works of what Roger Fry described as the "post-Impressionists". Through the writings and manifestos of painters, thinkers, authors and composers this lecture will trace the gradual parting of the ways since the late nineteenth century. It will show that post-Impressionism in the visual arts was merely one of many developments that began to emphasise the individuality of each art and its separation from its sisters. The lecture will include musical examples and visual presentation.

LECTURE 3: MUSIC AND THE FIRST WORLD WAR

With the centenary of World War I approaching this lecture will examine some of the music affected by the four-year conflict. Focusing primarily on classical music it will also include some account of the popular music of the time. Also touched on will be an examination of some of the composers killed in the war such as Farrar and Butterworth as well as a survey of the effect the war had upon, and the responses of, composers from France, Germany and elsewhere. All will be set against the background of war, politics and responses in other arts.


